Haitian Relief Update. Thank you to everyone who has contributed thus far to the Haitian Relief efforts in Haiti. So far, \$12,814 has been given by members and friends of our congregation. These funds have been sent to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA).

- PDA has provided \$500,000 toward the relief efforts on behalf of Presbyterians around the country and the world.
- Upon the recommendation of our Mission Outreach Committee, our Session authorized giving \$10,000 from the Elizabeth Spoor Mission Fund to Frank McKinney's Caring House Project Foundation. Frank has been working in Haiti for years, building basic houses in villages. After the earthquake, he organized a team of paramedics and trained rescuers from Delray Beach, Davie and West Palm Beach as well as a medical team and flew them to Haiti to join in the relief efforts. Our church is grateful for this designated bequest from Betty Spoor which made this financial support possible.
- We have received a number of requests from individuals and organizations seeking to help the relief efforts in Haiti. Listed below is information and contact numbers.
