**Stewardship 2012 ...** Our thanks to members and friends of our congregation who have made their stewardship pledge for 2012. Thus far, we have received 284 pledges, totaling \$783,627. Pledge cards are available in the pews. You may place these in the offering plate, mail them to the church office or call Christine Davis in the financial office (276-6338, ext. 16), and make a verbal pledge by phone. Let us all be faithful to our calling as disciples of Christ and support the work of Christ's Church.

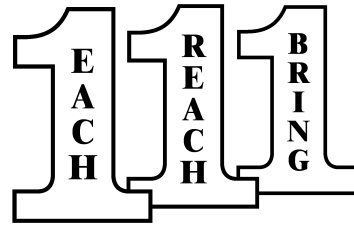
